In Viterbo, an italian city in the Lazio region, Giacinta Brettoni, a young noble belonging to the faction of the Guelphs, is bound to join a nunnery from the day she was born, but his family's misfortune will lead her to give up on the idea and marry a wealthy man who is new to the town.

In the meantime, Jacopo degli Altofonte, a poet from Sicily, is summoned to Federico II's court. The initial marvel will turn to anguish when he falls madly in love with the daughter of the ruler, Selvaggia, who is promised to the most cruel man of his time. Their stories and Guido's intertwine. Guido is a Lombardian chemist on the run together with his family from Lodi, a city which surrended to the Empire,

Unhappy love, daring escapes and fierce battles interweave in a "choral" novel, where everyone's stories will end up converging in the city of Viterbo, culminating in the final battle: the small but valiant city will face the enormous army of the Empire.
